LET'S CLEAR THIS UP: FEES AREN'T FINES.



Fees are like paying for your yearly car registration, not court fines for breaking the law by recklessly driving

POLLUTION ISN'T FREE, FAMILIES AND LOCAL BUSINESSES ALREADY PAY THE PRICE

Every year, the production of steel in Southwestern PA are estimated to cause:

- **50-92** people dying prematurely
- **54** ER visits for respiratory reasons
- **24,949** people with asthma
- **3,988** missed days of work
- **6,965** missed days of school



Every single year, this leads to between **\$800 million to \$1.4 billion in health costs** and **shrinks our regional economy by \$16 million.**

A FEW BIG POLLUTERS ARE DOING MOST OF THE DAMAGE

Top 3 Largest Emitters in 2022

1 US Steel Edgar Thomson
4,053,185 tons of monitored air pollutants

2 Springdale Power Station
1,775,612 tons of monitored air pollutants

3 US Steel Clairton Coke Works
781,816 tons of monitored air pollutants



THE MAJOR POLLUTERS DRIVING THE POLLUTION ARE NOT SMALL BUSINESSES



1. Three facilities drive most of the air pollution in the region.
2. They are not small businesses. They are **multi-billion dollar corporations.**
3. They are some of the worst polluters in the state for multiple toxic emissions
4. Our friends and families pay the price with their lungs, health, and tax dollars

FLAT FEES LET BIG POLLUTERS OFF THE HOOK

Fee Rates	Flat \$8,000 fee for all major sources	Tiered fees based on actual pollution
Major Source Annual Pollution Fee	Pollution level doesn't matter, everyone pays the same	Bigger polluters pay more than smaller polluters
Funding Federally Required Programs	Funding gap delays inspections, permit approvals, and enforcement	Fully funds inspections, permits, and enforcement
Impact on Most Local Businesses	Most local businesses are unaffected	Most local businesses are unaffected

THE CLEAN AIR FEE UPDATE IS STUCK AND INDUSTRY OPPOSITION HAS HELPED DELAY PROGRESS

- 1 Allegheny County Health Department unanimously recommended updating its air permit fees
- 2 U.S. Steel is opposing the change, claiming it is unfair and too expensive
- 3 The proposal is stuck in County Council. We **need 10 votes** to pass.

OVERVIEW

Air Permit Fees Are:

1. Required by federal law with the 1990 Clean Air Act
2. Paid by large polluters, not taxpayers
3. Funds inspections, monitoring, permit reviews, and protecting impacted communities

HOW THEY WORK



Company pays a permit fee to Allegheny County Health Department (ACHD) to pollute



ACHD uses funds for inspections, processing permits, enforcement, and funding clean air efforts



Air quality and community health improves

UPDATED PROPOSAL IS IF THEY PRODUCE MORE POLLUTION, THEN PAY MORE FEES

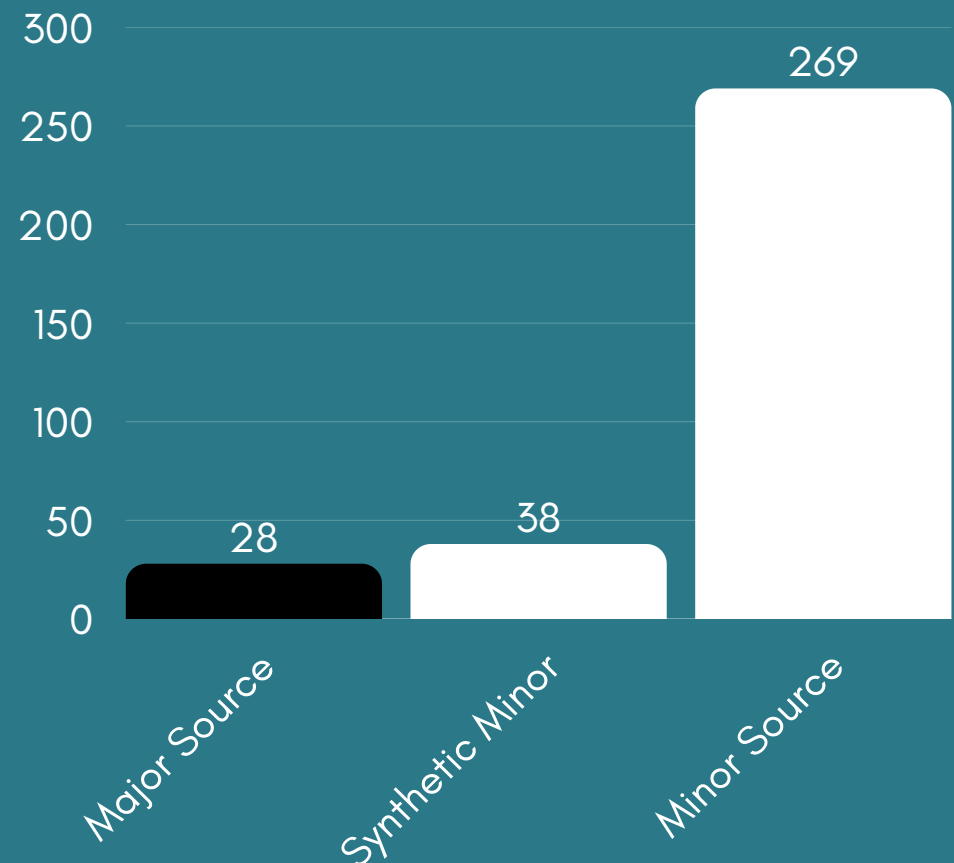
Biggest polluters pay more. Most will see much smaller changes.

<i>Category (Pollution Produced)</i>	<i>Ex. Companies</i>	<i>Current Daily fee</i>	<i>New Daily Fee</i>
<i>Major Source (High)</i>	Large steel mills, coke plants, etc.	\$21.90	\$41.07-\$150.58
<i>Synthetic Minor (Moderate)</i>	Asphalt/Paving, metalworking, concrete	\$10.95	\$22.59
<i>Minor Source (Low)</i>	Dry cleaners, crematories, auto shops	\$5.47	\$11.63

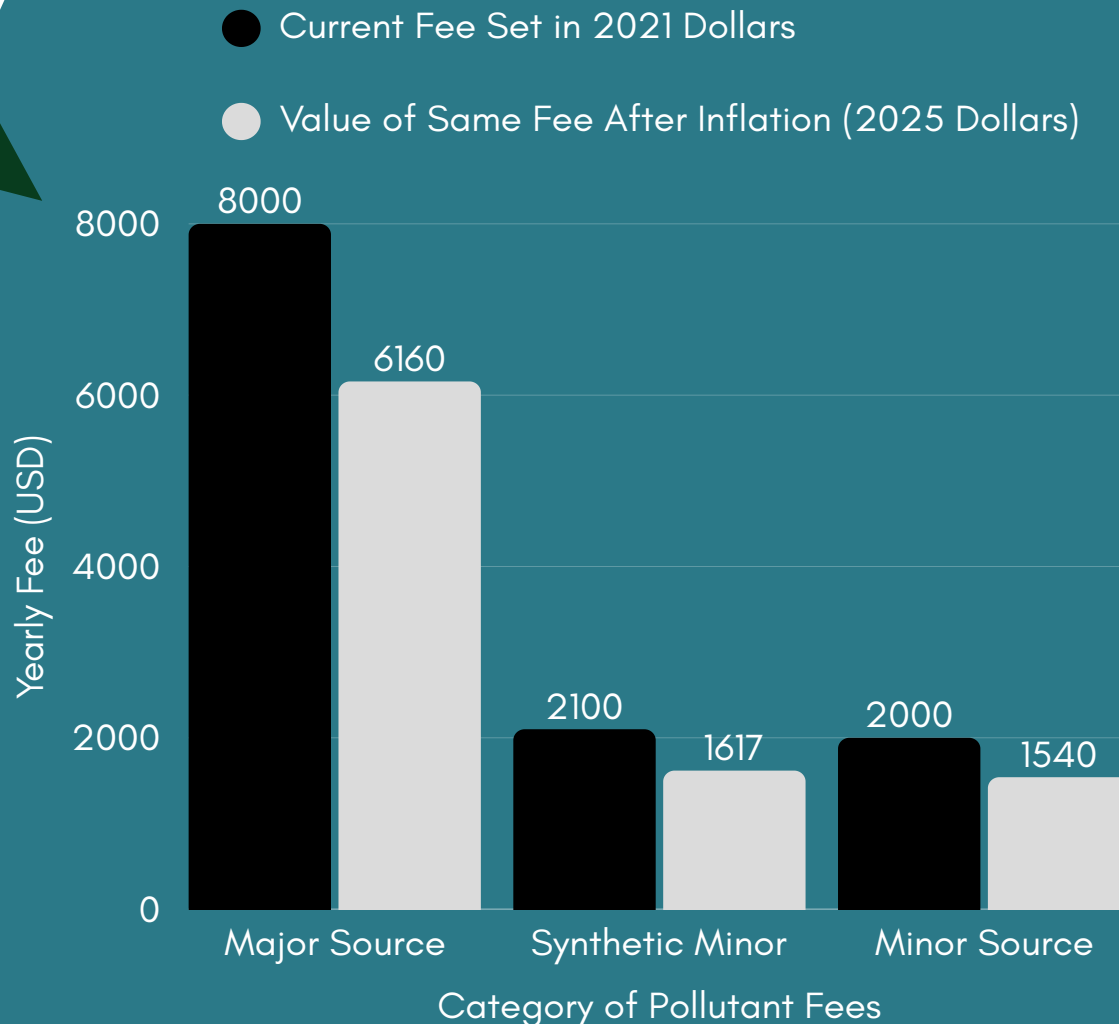
MOST SOURCES ARE SMALL AND WILL SEE MODEST CHANGES, BUT BIG POLLUTERS PAY THE MOST

- 91.6% of permit holders are minor sources of pollution
- Minor source fees are increasing but the daily cost is similar to parking in Pittsburgh
- Highest fees target top polluters like major industrial facilities, not small businesses

AIR QUALITY PROGRAMS TOOK OVER A 20% CUT DUE TO INFLATION WITHOUT A SINGLE VOTE CAST

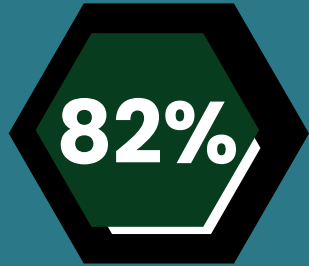


This means an \$8,000 fee from back then covers only \$5,840 worth of inspections, monitoring, and enforcement today.

In practical terms, Allegheny County Health Department has already taken over a **20% cut in clean air funding** without a single vote cast to do it.

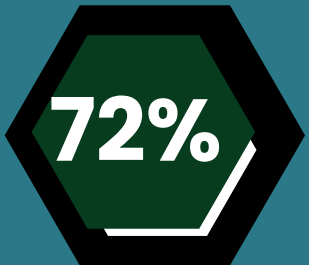

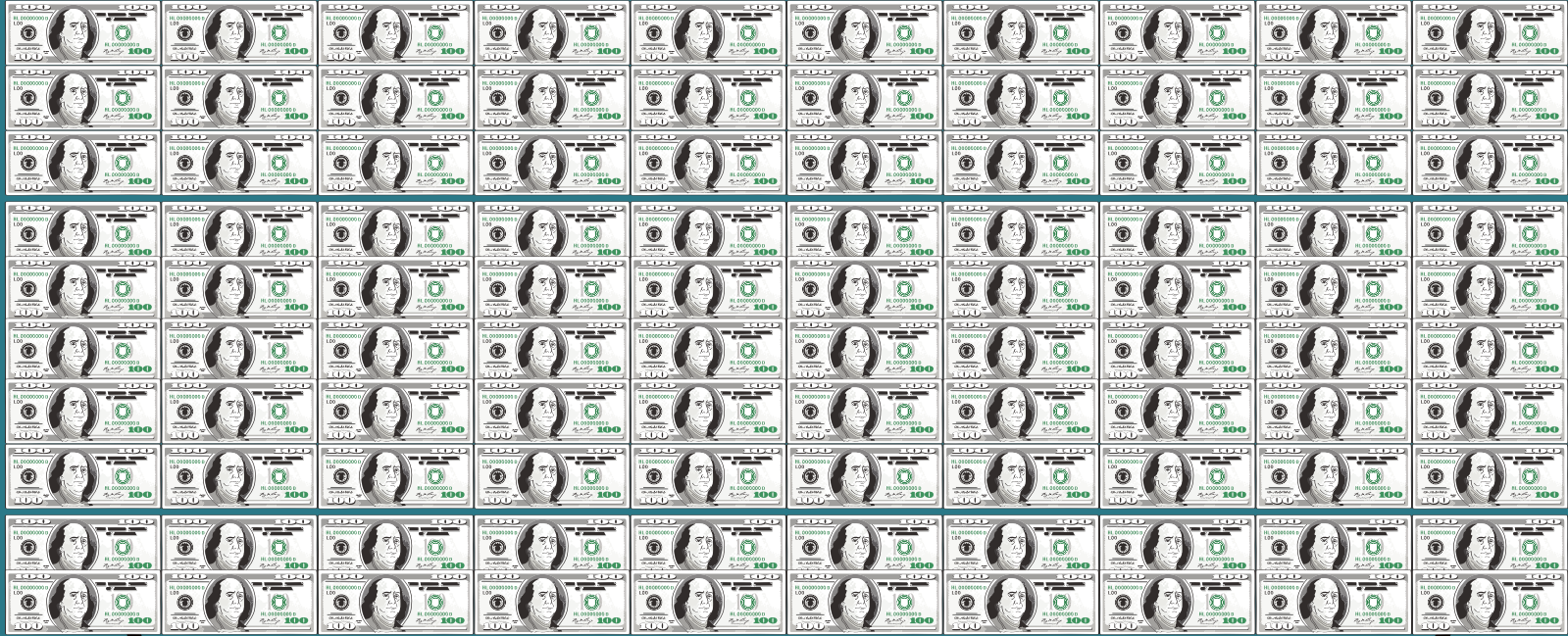
Clairton Coke Works Violated the Law by Releasing Untreated Emissions **167 Times** Last Year.
